



The Jesus Series: **Power and Revelation**

5.13.2018 || John 4:19-26

Sir, the woman said, “I can see that you are a prophet. ²⁰Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain, but you Jews claim that the place where we must worship is in Jerusalem.” ²¹“Woman,” Jesus replied, “believe me, a time is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. ²²You Samaritans worship what you do not know; we worship what we do know, for salvation is from the Jews. ²³Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. ²⁴God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in the Spirit and in truth.” ²⁵The woman said, “I know that Messiah” (called Christ) “is coming. When he comes, he will explain everything to us.” ²⁶Then Jesus declared, “I, the one speaking to you—I am he.”

Jesus ushers in a **new way of life** in God, that is **present but not yet perfected**, and distinguished by the indivisible characteristics of divine **power and revelation**.

The one sitting on the throne said, “Look, I am making everything new!” **Rev 21:5**

If anyone is in Christ: The old has gone, the new is here!
2 Cor 5:17

A new way of life

- Jesus is asked about the most **controversial** religious issue of the day.
- He looks beyond her question to the outcome of His ministry: Not a **place** but a **people** of worship.
- It is spiritually fruitless to argue about that which is **passing away**.



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Present but not yet perfected

- Jesus is the **mountain** and **temple** of God, in whom true worship arises.
 - The Samaritans experienced life change in Him, but a **greater hour** was coming and is still left to come.
- Believers live in the Kingdom of God [*God's reign – Ps 103:19*] **already** but not **yet**.
 - Some believers struggle to realize the Kingdom is **here**.
 - Some believers struggle to realize the Kingdom is **still to come**.

But very truly I tell you, it is for your good that I am going away. Unless I go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. **John 16:7**

For the kingdom of God is not a matter of talk but of power. **1 Cor 4:20**

[They encouraged the Disciples] to continue in the faith, and saying, "Through many tribulations we must enter the kingdom of God." **Acts 14:22**

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Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit **John 3:6**

His divine power has given us everything we need for life and godliness through the knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence. **2 Peter 1:3**

Power and Revelation

- All the Christian life is **supernatural** in nature, as God's spirit gives and sustains life in our spirit.
- God has ordained this power to come through **knowledge**.
- **Spirit** and **Truth** are not opposed as some believe. They are indivisible characteristics of life in God.

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Life Truth: God seeks those who will worship Him in the light of His **self-revelation**, not the darkness of **human imagination**. If he offends our sensibilities, it is us who must change.

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
