


3. The **outcome** of our labor depends on God's **sovereign** grace.

Opening Scripture Reading from Colossians 1:13-23: He has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. He [Jesus] is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him. And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be preeminent. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross. And you, who once were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, he has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before him, if indeed you continue in the faith, stable and steadfast, not shifting from the hope of the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed in all creation under heaven...

Upcoming @Agape


Wednesday January 9th and 16th – **GROW classes** from 6:30p-8:00p

Sermon: 1 Corinthians 3:1-13, 16 || David McConnell

I, brothers, could not address you as spiritual people, but as people of the flesh, as infants in Christ. **2**I fed you with milk, not solid food, for you were not ready for it. And even now you are not yet ready, **3**for you are still of the flesh. For while there is jealousy and strife among you, are you not of the flesh and behaving only in a human way? **4**For when one says, "I follow Paul," and another, "I follow Apollos," are you not being merely human? **5**What then is Apollos? What is Paul? Servants through whom you believed, as the Lord assigned to each. **6**I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. **7**So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth. **8**He who plants and he who waters are one, and each will receive his wages according to his labor. **9**For we are God's fellow workers. You are God's field, God's building. **10**According to the grace of God given to me, like a skilled master builder I laid a foundation, and someone else is building upon it. Let each one take care how he builds upon it. **11**For no one can lay a foundation other than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ. **12**Now if anyone builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw **13**each one's work will become manifest, for the Day will disclose it, because it will be revealed by fire, and the fire will test what sort of work each one has done....**16**Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you?

1. Nothing we **build** will **last** without Christ as our foundation.
2. Spiritual **maturity** is characterized by **growth** in godliness.
