A reading from Psalm 3 (CSB): LORD, how my foes increase! There are many who attack me. ²Many say about me, "There is no help for him in God." ³But you, LORD, are a shield around me, my glory, and the one who lifts up my head. ⁴I cry aloud to the LORD, and he answers me from his holy mountain. ⁵I lie down and sleep; I wake again because the LORD sustains me. ⁶I will not be afraid of thousands of people who have taken their stand against me on every side. ⁷Rise up, LORD! Save me, my God! You strike all my enemies on the cheek; you break the teeth of the wicked. ⁸Salvation belongs to the LORD; may your blessing be on your people.

Anger Defined:

Anger is an emotion of **displeasure**, awakened in defense of that which is **good** (loved and valuable) and released against something that is **evil** (unfair and cruel).
